


There are two types of plaques.




There are two processes to create plaques.




These blue plaques document significant people who impacted Soho.



But, there is a large part & important part of Soho's heritage missing from the plaques.




Soho District has been famous for its entertainment industry since 19th century.

But they are underthreat and are being closed down by Westminster city council after some resident complaints.




Open club Closed club




Save Soho is an organization who is trying to protect these venues since the closure of Madame Jojo's.




There are ten famous venues already closed as a result of gentrification. The last remaining venues have a worrying future ahead and do not know if they will survive or be closed down by the Council.

How could we collaborate with both Save Soho and new local business, so that we can safeguard the future of the performing arts and creative spirit in Soho?


